- According to national COVID-19 <u>trackers</u>, there are currently over 86,012 cases of coronavirus confirmed by lab tests in all 50 states with over 1,301 deaths reported.
- According to the White House task force briefing Thursday night:
 - President Trump claimed to have a great meeting with the leaders of the G20
 - President Trump held a meeting with all the governors in the U.S.
 - The COVID relief package will include: job retention loans, direct cash payments, expanded unemployment benefits, critical support for the hardest hit industries, over \$100 billion for hospitals, \$45 billion for the disaster relief fund and more.
 - FEMA has shipped over 9 million N95 masks, 20 million face masks, 3.1 million face shields, nearly 6,000 ventilators, 2.6 million gowns, 14.6 million gloves.
 - The USNS Comfort will be leaving for New York on Saturday and will arrive on Monday.
- New states with restrictions to "non-essential" business or implementing "shelter-in-place" policies are: New Hampshire
- The next wave of coronavirus cases expected to hit <u>Louisiana</u>.
- Officials see hope as cases in Washington appear to be leveling off
- President Trump <u>cast doubt</u> Thursday on New York Gov. Andrew M. Cuomo's assertion that his state, will need 30,000 ventilators to properly care for the influx of patients anticipated to flood hospitals in coming weeks.
- Representative Thomas Massie, Republican of Kentucky, said on Friday that he would insist on a recorded vote on the \$2 trillion stimulus package, <u>delaying its passage</u>.
- New York Gov. Andrew Cuomo (D) said on Friday that he will ask President Trump for the authorization to build <u>four additional temporary hospitals</u> as the state deals with a rising number of coronavirus cases
- A <u>US navy ship arrived in Los Angeles</u> Friday to help relieve local hospitals expected to be overburdened by coronavirus patients
- GM deal for ventilators stalls as White House shops around
- <u>US embassies and consulates</u> around the world are diverting most of their resources to the task of evacuating U.S. citizens.
