U.S. News

- According to national COVID-19 <u>trackers</u>, there are currently over 143,532 cases of coronavirus confirmed by lab tests in all 50 states with over 2,572 deaths reported. Notable new cases include:
 - New York City has reported its <u>first death of a child</u> to COVID-19, one of 14 new fatalities overnight that brought its grim toll to 790 by Monday morning,
- According to the White House task force briefing Sunday evening:
 - The FDA authorized a new test developed by Abbott Labs that delivers lightning-fast results in as little as five minutes
 - Abbott has stated that they will begin delivering 50,000 tests each day, starting this week.
 - Hydroxychloroquine is being administered to 1,100 patients people in New York along with the Z-Pak, which is azithromycin
 - The FDA is also allowing the emergency use of a blood-related therapy called convalescent plasma as an experimental treatment for seriously ill patients.
 - Due to Project Airbridge, a flight arrived at JFK Airport, New York, this morning, filled with 80 tons of personal protective equipment, including 130,000 N95 respirators — those are the ones that we were talking about before — 1.8 million face masks and gowns, 10.3 million gloves, and many other things
 - FEMA has scheduled 19 additional flights and is adding more daily. We hope to have about 50 flights.
 - Humana and Cigna, are announcing that they will waive co-pays
 - President Trump is going to tell Secretary Mnuchin and also our great Secretary of Labor, to immediately start looking into the restoring of the deductibility of meals and entertainment costs for corporations that set the restaurant business back a lot when it was done originally, and then done not so long ago.
 - The US will be extending our guidelines to April 30th to slow the spread
 - President Trump believes the economy will recover by June 1
- New states with restrictions to "non-essential" business or implementing "shelter-in-place" policies are: <u>Maryland</u>
- Notable new companies announcing layoffs/furloughs in the U.S. are: Macy's, Seaworld, 20th Century Fox, Build-a-Bear and Cheesecake Factory.
- Notable new companies that have stopped or are modifying production in the U.S. are: Hyundai and See's Candies
- President Trump announced on Sunday evening an <u>extension on federal social distancing</u> <u>quidelines</u> throughout the month of April.
 - Dr. <u>Anthony Fauci</u>, the government's top infectious disease expert, said Monday that <u>Fauci says task force 'argued strongly' with Trump to extend coronavirus guidelines</u> another month as the U.S. grapples with the fallout of the novel coronavirus pandemic.
- The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) on Sunday issued an <u>emergency-use authorization for</u> <u>a pair of anti-malaria drugs</u> as health officials work to combat the rapid spread of the novel coronavirus.
- The Seattle area, home of the first known coronavirus case in the United States and the place where the virus claimed 37 of its first 50 victims, is <u>now seeing evidence that strict containment</u> <u>strategies, imposed in the earliest days of the outbreak</u>, are beginning to pay off — at least for now.
- A <u>commercial aircraft carrying 80 tons of gloves, masks, gowns and other medical supplies</u> from Shanghai touched down in New York on Sunday, the first of 22 scheduled flights that White House officials say will funnel much-needed goods to the United States by early April as it battles the world's largest coronavirus outbreak.
- The city of <u>Detroit</u> is gearing up to become a coronavirus epicenter.

- Two major U.S. health insurers, <u>Cigna and Humana</u>, are waiving all out-of-pocket costs for coronavirus treatments nationwide.
- Amazon workers are reportedly <u>planning to walk out of a New York warehouse on Monday</u> over the company's decision to keep the facility open despite an employee alleging as many as five to seven workers there have tested positive for the coronavirus.
