Notable Updates

U.S. News

- According to national COVID-19 <u>trackers</u>, there are currently over 188,247 cases of coronavirus confirmed by lab tests in all 50 states with over 3,921 deaths reported. Notable new cases include:
 - At least <u>830 new coronavirus deaths</u> were reported yesterday, the most reported in a single day
 - o At least 80% of Americans are under a stay at home warning
 - New York City Mayor Bill DeBlasio pleads for help as the coronavirus <u>death toll passes</u> 1,000
- Detroit is <u>becoming America's next</u> coronavirus hotspot
- Louisiana sees largest spike in reported coronavirus cases in the past 24 hours
- California releases 3,500 prisoners amidst coronavirus outbreak
- In Washington, hospitalization for the coronavirus is down by more than 20% from last week, suggesting that social distancing is working
- Hawaii reports its <u>first coronavirus related death</u>
- New states with restrictions to "non-essential" business or implementing "shelter-in-place" policies are: <u>Texas</u> and <u>Louisiana</u>
- Notable new companies announcing layoffs/furloughs in the U.S. are: Kohl's, Gap, and JCPenney
- Notable new companies that have stopped or are modifying production in the U.S. are: <u>Ford Motor Co.</u>, <u>John Deere</u>, and <u>Kylie Cosmetics and KKW Beauty</u>

International News

- According to global COVID-19 <u>trackers and official counts</u>, there are at least 868,100 cases confirmed globally in over 171 countries with at least 43,010 deaths. Notable new cases include:
 - In Italy, new daily infections have fallen from a peak of over 6,500 on March 21
 - Spain saw its <u>deadliest day</u> with 9,222 new coronavirus cases and 849 deaths
 - The UK's hospital coronavirus death toll death toll is up 31% from yesterday
 - o Iran's coronavirus death toll passes 3,000
- <u>Japan and South Korea</u> tighten their borders amidst coronavirus outbreak
- Taiwan will spend \$35 billion fighting the coronavirus and will donate 10 million masks
