Notable Updates

U.S. News

- According to national COVID-19 <u>trackers</u>, there are currently over 1 million cases of coronavirus confirmed by lab tests in all 50 states with over 59,136 deaths reported. Notable new cases include:
 - The U.S. reported over 1 million coronavirus cases as the death toll surpasses the total number of U.S. troops that died during the Vietnam War, which last more than 10 years
 - NYC Emergency room doctor Lorna Breen died by suicide after weeks of treating coronavirus patients and recovering from the virus herself. This has raised more questions on how our healthcare workers are stretched thin and mental health is being compromised
 - o In North Carolina, <u>a pug named Winston is believed to be the first dog that contracted the coronavirus in the U.S.</u>
- Notable new companies / organizations / states in favor of reopening the economy are:
 - Alabama Governor Kay Ivey unveiled a safer-at-home order that will allow some business to reopen on April 30. Retail stores will be allowed to reopen but must maintain a 50% occupancy rate, schools and restaurants will remain closed, but beaches will reopen
 - Ohio Governor Mike DeWine announced that masks will no longer be required in retail establishments, going back on his Monday announcement saying they were required
- Notable new companies announcing layoffs/furloughs in the U.S. are:
 - Trip Advisors is laying off an additional 900 employees, adding to the 200 that they had originally laid off earlier this year as CEO Steve Kaufer will forgo his salary for the rest of the year
 - <u>Uber is reportedly laying off 20% off their employees</u> as the Chief Technology Officer resigns
- Notable new companies halting production:
 - Ruiz Foods company in Tulare County is temporarily shutting down production after some of its team members tested positive for COVID-19. Ruiz Foods says it will close several production lines at its facilities in Dinuba and Tulare in order to limit the spread of the virus to other team members
- New states with restrictions to "non-essential" business or implementing "shelter-in-place" policies are:
 - Massachusetts Governor Charlie Baker extends the states stay-at-home order until May 18
 - New Orleans Mayor Latoya Cantrell suggested on Tuesday that canceling the 2021
 Mardi Gras festivities is "something we have to think about."
- With growing fears of a meat shortage hitting America's supermarkets as early as next week, <u>Trump signed an executive order under the Defense Production Act to keep meat processing plants open</u> amid the coronavirus pandemic
- Vice President Pence visited a Mayo Clinic facility in Rochester, MN and was the only one in the building not wearing a face mask, violating their mandatory mask policy. He was briefed in the last several days that this was their rules to exercise caution during the coronavirus outbreak
- The Stock market soared 500 points this morning after hopeful news from Gilead Sciences on a
 potential coronavirus vaccine. Gilead also released the results of its own study, which showed
 improvement in patients taking remdesivir to treat the virus
- Global retail spending is expected to fall by over \$500 billion in 2020 due to national lockdowns and lack of consumer confidence and stability
- Verizon, AT&T and Comcast have extended their offers not to terminate service nor charge late fees to customers who are struggling with their monthly bills because of the coronavirus pandemic

- Online news publication Axios returned \$4.8 million that they received from Congress's Paycheck Protection Program, amid public backlash
- On May 6, National Nurses Day, Dunkin' Donut will be distributing free coffee and donuts to healthcare workers to thank them for working on the frontlines during the coronavirus outbreak. Since March, Dunkin' has already distributed hundreds of thousands of free cups of coffee and donuts to hospitals and emergency sites all over America.
- PepsiCo's soda sales declined this quarter due to closed restaurants, theaters and sports
 venues. However, they saw a boost in breakfast item snack sales as more Americans at home
 purchased Quaker oatmeal and Frito-Lay chips
- Reports show that people with eating disorders are struggling more than ever as they are finding few foods that are 'safe' to eat during the coronavirus outbreak
- The U.S. Navy paid contractors \$600 million which it had previously withheld due to poor performance in order to drum up finances for suppliers ravaged by the coronavirus outbreak's economic fallout. The U.S. Air Force also did the same

International News

- According to global COVID-19 <u>trackers and official counts</u>, there are at least 3.1 million cases confirmed globally in over 177 countries with at least 218,456 deaths. Notable new cases include:
 - India has only reported 1,000 coronavirus deaths despite being the world's second most populated country with 1.3 billion people
 - <u>Canada is seeing a higher coronavirus death toll than they previously predicted,</u> now reporting over 3,000 deaths
 - <u>Lebanese Government officials are citing that 75 % of citizens need aid</u> after hungry protestors take to the streets
- The Prime Minister of Spain Pedro Sanchez has announced a four-phase plan to lift its
 coronavirus restrictions and return to a 'new normal' by the end of June. Each region would relax
 restrictions at a different pace, depending on the severity of the outbreak
- Dentists in Japan will now conduct coronavirus tests, in hopes to curb the spread of the virus.
 Japan also have the highest number of dentists per capita
- 2 Million Australians have downloaded a coronavirus tracking app called COVIDSafe, which is
 designed to help health authorities trace people who may have come into contact with someone
 who has the coronavirus
- <u>In Germany, doctors are posing naked to protest PPE shortages.</u> On Monday, Germany received a shipment of 10 million face masks from China, as wearing face masks have become mandatory in many public places across the country
- As European Governments continue to bailout big airline companies like Air France-KLM and <u>Lufthansa</u>, Brussels is calling on airlines to use this time to 'go green' and reduce their carbon footprint, enforcing the kerosene tax
- The Financial Conduct Authority is cracking down on U.K. banks that have been preying on corporate clients requesting financial assistance during the coronavirus outbreak
- China's brands continue to take a hit from the coronavirus outbreak. Americans' opinion of China is at its lowest point in 15 years, and 62% of those surveyed said they viewed China's power and influence as a "major threat."
- Sainsbury, the second largest <u>supermarket chain in the U.K. is reopening 100 petrol stations</u> after being closed due to coronavirus fears
